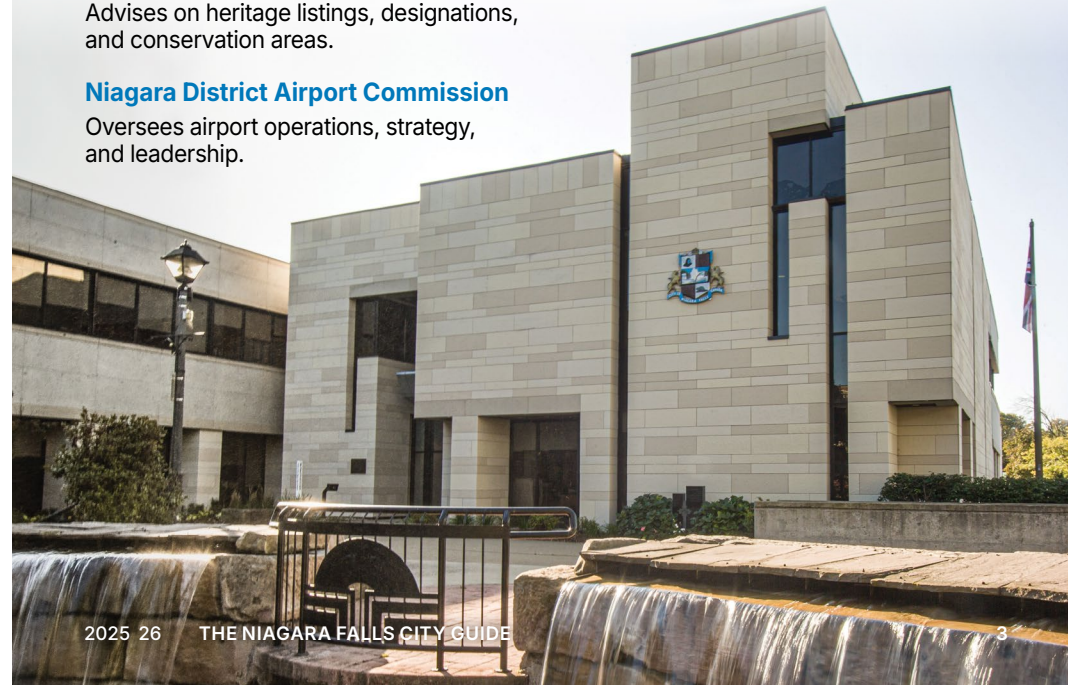

The City of Niagara Falls is proud to introduce **At Your Service Niagara Falls (AYSNF)** – a new, centralized customer service model designed to make accessing municipal services easier, faster, and more convenient for you.

The AYSNF model replaces various department extensions with “one-window” service, supported by centralized customer service staff.

Its focus is on *first-contact resolution* – meaning an AYSNF Customer Service Advisor will aim to resolve most inquiries during your first interaction.

If needed, we’ll connect you with the right person to handle your request quickly, so residents no longer have to remember individual department extensions.

The MacBain Community Centre is a 100,000 square foot multi-use facility that features a gymnasium, indoor pool with water slide, indoor track, squash court, indoor play structure, two racquetball courts, and multipurpose rooms. In addition, outdoor amenities include an accessible playground, splash pad, skate park, fitness equipment, pavilion, and washrooms. The centre is also home to a branch of the Niagara Falls Public Library.

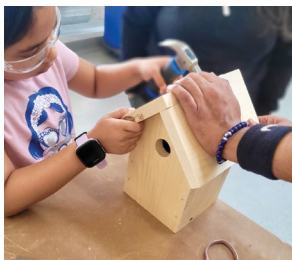

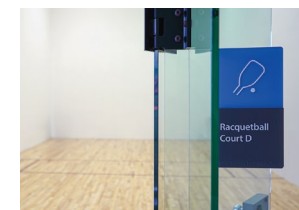


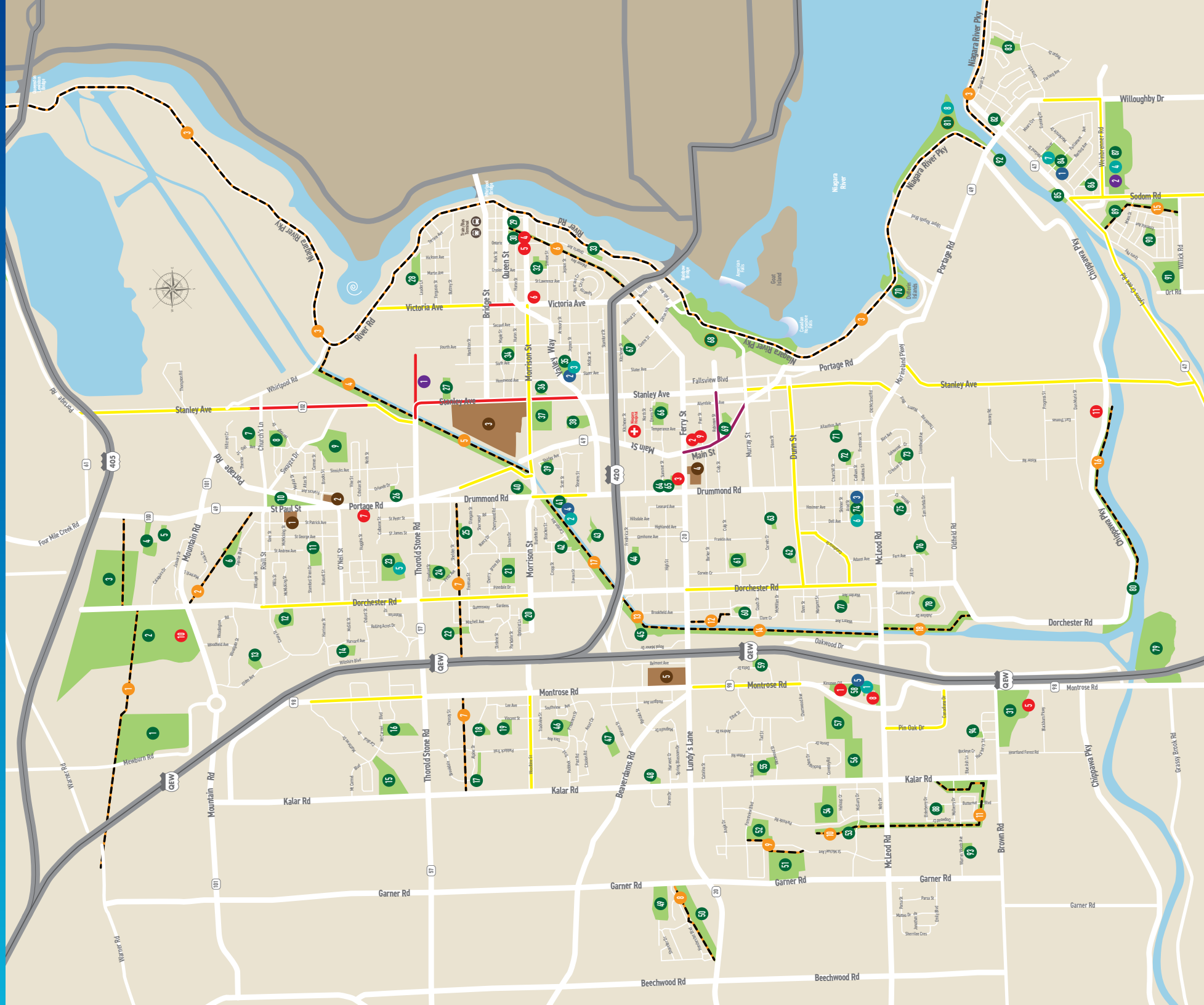
