

COMMUNITY, SUSTAINABILITY & INFRASTRUCTURE

Niagara Falls is strengthening the core services and infrastructure that support daily life, including roads, transportation networks, and access to health care. Through strategic land use, long-range planning, and sustainability-focused investments, the City is building strong foundations for future generations. Aligned with the **Environmental and Financial Sustainability pillars**, these investments enhance climate resilience while ensuring infrastructure and essential services are planned and delivered responsibly for the long term.



A City in motion *grows* with intention.

Building the Foundations of a Growing City

- ▶ 237 acres of new employment land acquired on Sodom Road to support long-term job creation.
- ▶ Long-range servicing plans aligning infrastructure with projected housing and employment growth.
- ▶ Coordinated planning ensures growth areas include transportation, servicing, parks, and community amenities.

Infrastructure Renewal for a City on the Move

- ▶ More than 22 km of surface treatment and 18 km of road rehabilitation completed between 2023 and 2025.
- ▶ Over \$16M secured from provincial and federal partners for water, wastewater, and road upgrades.
- ▶ Reconstruction of McLeod, Montrose, and Biggar improving access to the new South Niagara Hospital.
- ▶ Renewals to stormwater, sanitary, and watermain systems strengthen resiliency and support neighbourhood growth.

South Niagara Hospital

Caring for a growing community means investing in world-class health care. Planned to open in 2028, the South Niagara Hospital is a state-of-the-art, 1.3 million square foot facility designed to meet the evolving needs of Niagara residents for generations to come.

This landmark \$3.6B investment will transform how care is delivered across the region. Located in Niagara Falls at the corner of Montrose and Biggar Roads, the hospital will provide a full scope of services, including emergency and critical care, diagnostic, therapeutic, and surgical services. It will also be home to specialized Centres of Excellence focused on complex care, wellness in aging, and stroke care.

Investing in Our Infrastructure

Operation Smooth Roads is the City's five-year plan to upgrade, repair, and renew streets across Niagara Falls. Millions of dollars are being invested to improve road conditions, enhance safety, and keep residents and visitors moving smoothly.

Road conditions are regularly assessed using data-driven analysis, ensuring improvements are prioritized based on road age, condition, traffic volumes, and maintenance history.

As work continues across the City, Operation Smooth Roads signage marks streets under improvement — a clear sign that smoother travels are on the way.



Safer, More Connected Transportation Networks

- ▶ Transportation and Active Transportation Master Plans nearing completion to guide future mobility.
- ▶ Major cycling, walking, and transit upgrades improving safety and access around the hospital precinct.
- ▶ \$1.93M secured for 5 new EV charging infrastructure at municipal and Niagara Parks locations.



Green Corridors, Parks, & Community Spaces

- ▶ Phase 1 of the NS&T Trail is complete, creating a continuous green recreational corridor.
- ▶ Dozens of neighbourhood parks and play spaces renewed through multi-year investment.
- ▶ Successful protection of the rare American Water Willow during Beck Road Bridge reconstruction.
- ▶ Urban Forest and Parks Master Plan projects are expanding canopy cover and improving ecological health.





Destination Niagara

Niagara Falls is building toward something bigger - a bold vision to establish the region as a world-class destination for leisure, business, and culture.

Destination Niagara is a multibillion-dollar strategy designed to create new world-class attractions, elevate local arts and culture, and strengthen the region's transportation network, with the ambitious goal of welcoming 25 million visitors annually.

Niagara District Airport

A key pillar of Destination Niagara is strengthening how people connect to our region - and Niagara District Airport is central to that vision.

In partnership with the Province, plans are underway to transform the airport from a general aviation facility into a modern regional gateway capable of supporting commercial air service. Expanding the runway by 3,000 feet has the potential to generate more than \$1B in economic output and support over 7 million passenger movements, significantly strengthening Niagara's tourism and business connections.

Together, these investments position Niagara District Airport as a critical gateway within Destination Niagara, connecting the region to new markets and unlocking lasting economic opportunity.

Infrastructure Supporting Economic Growth

- ▶ \$2.8M renovation transformed the historic train station into a modern transit and GO hub.
- ▶ Partnership on Niagara District Airport redevelopment improving regional connectivity.
- ▶ Planning underway for new employment land servicing.

A Diversified Tourism & Culture Economy

- ▶ New tourism products and cultural initiatives, including the Music City strategy, broaden the visitor experience beyond the Falls.

Strategic Advocacy

- ▶ Collaboration with regional, provincial, and federal partners through AMO, Border Mayors, and Great Lakes initiatives to advance City priorities.




Modern Digital Transformation


