VACCINATION FAQ'S

Q: I am a parent of a child under 12 who participates in Minor Hockey and I am not fully vaccinated. Will I be able to enter the facility to accompany my child and/or assist with getting his/her equipment on?

A: No, as a person age 18 or older, you are required to be fully vaccinated or show appropriate proof for an exemption to enter the facility. There are no exceptions to this.

Q: My child is 15 years old and not fully vaccinated and is planning to come watch his/her friends' game. Does he/she require full vaccination?

A: Yes, youth ages 12 and older who are not actively participating in organized activities are required to be fully vaccinated.

Q: I am an adult with a medical exemption and am not able to be vaccinated. Will I be able to enter the facility to watch my child skate?

A: For a medical exemption to be valid, proper written documentation as specified by the Province, must be presented to enter the facility. For more information on the specific documentation required please review Health Canada's Guidance for Proof Vaccination for Business and Organization (PDF).

Q: What is a valid form of proof of vaccination?

A vaccine receipt from the Ontario Ministry of Health indicating full vaccine status (second dose plus 14 days) will be accepted. The Province is working towards an enhanced vaccine certificate with QR code to be available by October 22.

Q: Is a recent negative COVID-19 test sufficient to gain access to the facility?

A: No, a negative test will not be sufficient to gain access to the facility.

Q. What if I don't want to disclose my vaccination status?

A: It is the discretion of the individual to determine whether they would like to disclose their vaccination status. Should they make the decision not to divulge this information, they will not be permitted to access settings that require proof of vaccination.

Q. What if I feel my child is too young to enter via the Fast Pass lane, am I allowed to enter with him or her?

A: No, the fast pass lane has been created to provide quicker access for players or skaters and coaches. If you feel your child is too young to go in on their own you both will have to wait in the regular line.

Q: The Province/City permits children under the age of 18 to enter without providing proof of vaccination when actively participating but my association requires proof for children 12+ to be rostered, what should we do?

Your child will not be permitted to play if your association has not approved them on the official roster so please contact the association or group that you are booked with to check their vaccination policy requirements.
