Independent Auditor's Report

To the City of Niagara Falls Clerk:

We have audited the accompanying Financial Statement - Form 4 of Victor Pietrangelo for City Council Campaign, which comprise the Statement of Campaign Income and Expenses and the calculation of Surplus or Deficit for the campaign from July 13, 2022 to January 3, 2023 relating to the election held on October 24, 2022. The Financial Statements have been prepared by the Candidate based on the accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Candidate's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Candidate is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 and for such internal control as the Candidate determines necessary to enable the preparation of statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Candidate's preparation and fair presentation of the statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Candidate's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Candidate, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

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Basis for Qualified Opinion

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in an election campaign, it is impracticable through auditing procedures to determine that the accounting records include all donations of goods and services, and receipts and disbursements. Accordingly, our verification of these transactions was limited to ensuring that the statements reflect the amounts recorded in the accounting records of Victor Pietrangelo for City Council Campaign in accordance with the accounting procedures established by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to income and expenses and surplus or deficit.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the statements present fairly, in all material respects, the income and expenses for the campaign period from July 13, 2022 to January 3, 2023 and the determination of surplus or deficit in accordance with the accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Use and Distribution

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to the fact these Financial Statements are prepared in accordance with the accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996. The Financial Statements are prepared to assist Victor Pietrangelo to meet the requirements of the City of Niagara Falls. Our report is intended solely for the Candidate and the City of Niagara Falls and should not be distributed to or used by parties other than the Candidate or the City of Niagara Falls.
