

# City Initiated Amendment for Delegated Authority

Official Plan Amendment No. 155 and Delegation By-law

The City of Niagara Falls has initiated an amendment to the City's Official Plan to update and implement policies to reflect the Supporting People and Businesses Act, 2021 ("Bill 13"), amendments to the Planning Act regarding delegating approval authority to staff for specific development applications.

# PROPOSED AMENDMENT

The Supporting People and Businesses Act, 2021 has made amendments to the Planning Act which permit Council to delegate planning decisions dealing with minor amendments to zoning by-laws as well as certain aspects related to draft approved plans including minor revisions, extension of a lapsing period, and approvals of draft plans. Additionally, delegating deeming by-laws, technical consent applications, lifting part lot control, and simple grant Community Improvement Plan applications is proposed. Delegating these authorities would help streamline the approval process for certain development applications.

The draft amendment to the Official Plan aims to:

- Introduce policies to outline criteria for specific types of development applications to be delegated and permit specific development applications to be delegated from Council to Staff; and
- Update policies to ensure consistency with delegated approval authority.
