



NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF ZONING BY-LAW NO. 2023-012

The Council of the Corporation of the City of Niagara Falls on the 28th day of February 2023 passed By-law No. 2023-012, under Section 34 of the *Planning Act*.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT

The purpose of By-law No. 2023-012 is to facilitate a consent application to create a new lot for a proposed detached dwelling and to recognize the siting of the existing dwelling.

The new lot was zoned a site specific R1E zone with a reduction of the lot area and lot frontage and the current residential detached dwelling was rezoned to a site specific R1E zone with a reduction of the lot area and the exterior side yard requirements.

By-law No. 2023-012 is in conformity with the City of Niagara Falls Official Plan and is not subject to an amendment to the Official Plan.

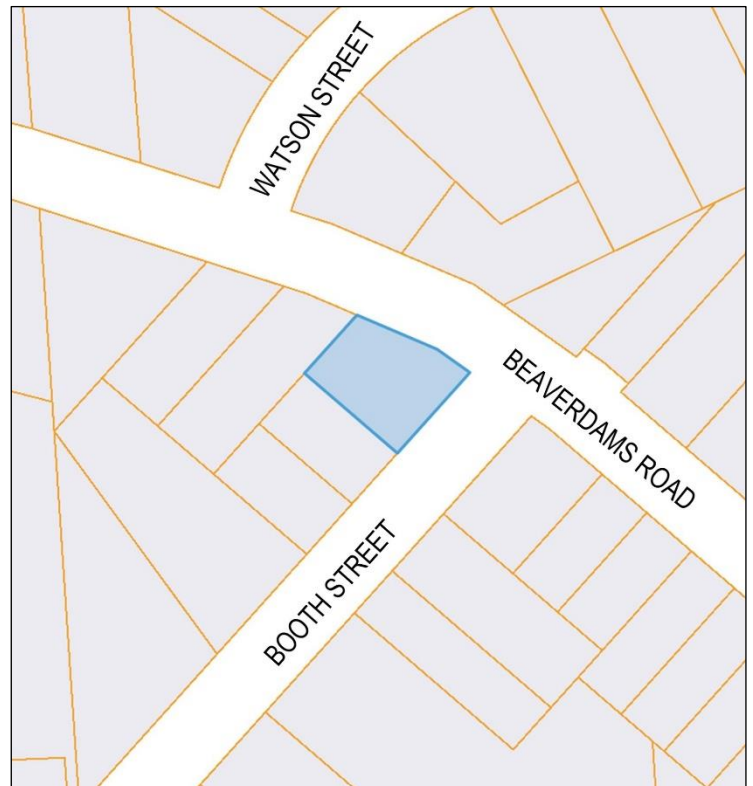

LEGAL NOTICE

Section 34 of the Planning Act:

Individuals, corporations and public bodies who made oral or written submissions to Council prior to the passage of the by-law may appeal the by-law to the Ontario Land Tribunal in respect of the by-law by filing a Notice of Appeal no later than the 22nd day of March 2023 with the Clerk. The appeal must set out the objection to the by-law and the reasons in support of the objection, together with the Ontario Land Tribunal filing fee of \$1,100.00 in the form of a certified cheque or money order, made payable to the Minister of Finance. An Appellant may request a reduction of the filing fee to \$400.00, if the Appellant is a private citizen or eligible community group. The request for a reduction in the fee must be made at the time of filing the appeal. Only individuals, corporations and public bodies who made oral or written submissions to Council prior to the passage of the by-law may appeal the by-law to the Ontario Land Tribunal. A Notice of Appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a Notice of Appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the Appeal unless, before the by-law was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to Council or, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

A Notice of Appeal, including the filing fee, must be submitted by the date set out above in order to constitute a valid Appeal. Failure to submit a complete Notice of Appeal or the fee of \$1,100.00 (or a reduced fee of \$400.00 for qualified Appellants) or both, on or before the date set out above will result in an incomplete Appeal application and will not be processed further.
