#### **Annual Road Strengthening and Resurfacing Program**

#### **ROAD CLOSURE**

**May 24<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024**

Motorists and the general public are hereby advised that Regional Road 43 (Bridge Street) from Stanley Avenue (Regional Road 102) to Victoria Avenue in the City of Niagara Falls will be closed to through traffic during working hours (typically 7:00am to 7:00pm) from **May 24<sup>th</sup> to May 28<sup>th</sup> (excluding Saturday and Sunday)**, weather permitting.

The daily road closure is necessary to complete top course asphalt paving on the above noted road. Placement of asphalt is weather dependent and should inclement weather be encountered, closure date(s) will be revised as necessary.

The detour route for the closure is as follows:

**Victoria Avenue, Valley Way, Morrison Street, Stanley Avenue**

Businesses and residents will have access during the closure but may be directed to take an alternate route to get to their destination and with the assistance of construction personnel on site. Businesses will remain open at all times. Motorists should anticipate extended delays accessing properties within the closure area.

Emergency services will also have access during the closure but may be directed to take an alternate route to get to their destination, prior notification will be provided.
