Dear Homeowner/Tenant/Business Owner:

**Re: City Contract 2024-04
2024 Asphalt Patching Program**

The City of Niagara Falls will be undertaking the replacement of the surface course asphalt on your street. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin the week of September 23rd, 2024 (weather permitting) and will be continuous until completion.

The street to be completed in this program is listed below. Unfortunately, a specific date cannot be determined as to when your street will be completed. **Please see revised construction limits below:**

This project will be carried out for the City of Niagara Falls by Circle P Paving.

In general, the work will consist of milling the existing asphalt, completing asphalt base repairs as required, adjusting manholes and catch basins to finished grade and the placement of surface course asphalt. **Please note due to the high traffic counts and concerns with pedestrian and vehicular safety; the contractor will be paving at night (2 nights total).** Due to the scope of the work involved, driveway accessibility may be affected during construction. Every effort will be made to give you notice in advance should this occur.

If we disturb your property during construction, the City or our Contractor will carry out the necessary repairs as quickly as possible. With respect to sod restoration, please be advised that the City's Contractor will water the sodded areas immediately after placement. To ensure proper root growth, the property owner is requested to continue to water the newly sodded areas after the initial watering by the City's Contractor.

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If you have an irrigation system on City property, you must spray paint, white paint only, or stake out the location of your irrigation system that is within 3 meters of the paved roadway. Only irrigation systems that have been correctly located by the property owner and are damaged by the contractor will be repaired. The property owner will be responsible for repairs to any irrigation system on City property that is damaged, which has not been located by the owner.
